

State Librarian's Report February 5, 2013

1. Hawaii State Library Centennial Celebration

The Hawaii State Library will celebrate its Centennial Anniversary now through the end of the year. There will be an Anniversary Celebration on Saturday, May 18, to coincide with the Hawaii Book and Music Festival. The Library will present an historical exhibit about the Hawaii State Library in the First Floor Reading Room from February to October. In addition, the Library will conduct special programs and new exhibits will be featured each month. A very brief history of the Hawaii State Library's origin: King David Kalakaua was elected an honorary member and donated his personal funds toward the establishment of the Honolulu Library and Reading Room Association, which was formed in 1879 to "provide a reading room for mechanics where they could spend an evening, enjoyably, away from the allurements of the saloons." The King also provided tax exemptions and a grant for the first permanent site on the corner of Hotel and Alakea Streets. The Honolulu Library and Reading Room Association eventually became the Library of Hawaii, which opened at its current King Street location on February 1, 1913. Governor Walter Frear, who had urged Andrew Carnegie to contribute \$100,000 for a new building, was issued the very first Reader's Card, and he became the new Library of Hawaii's first patron when he borrowed two books.

4. Ed2GO Personal Enrichment & Learning Collection Now Available

The Hawaii State Public Library System (HSPLS) now offers Ed2Go, a new Gale/Cengage Learning collection which provides users with additional opportunities to increase their personal and career development, help them lead more engaged and fulfilling lives, and support their lifelong learning interests. Hawaii residents statewide will be able to access hundreds of free instructor-led, online courses in a variety of subjects, ranging from personal finance to digital photography to health and wellness, and much more through the HSPLS website, www.librarieshawaii.org. Ed2Go courses are developed by expert instructors, many currently working at universities around the country, and have continuous enrollment dates. When enrolling in a class, instead of making a payment, HSPLS patrons will be able to enter their valid HSPLS library card and PIN number to apply for a free passcode.

5. More Than 4,000 e-Audiobooks Now Available Through One Click Digital

HSPLS has subscribed to the One Click Digital e-audiobook collection, which offers more than 4,000 audiobook titles, with new titles added each quarter. These are titles for all ages, and they can be used by an unlimited number of simultaneous users.



OneClickDigital has many features that will give our patrons who enjoy audiobooks valuable options:

- All titles allow unlimited, simultaneous users. No need to reserve the title they want to listen to
- Up to ten audiobook titles can be checked out for up to 21 days, with the option for patrons to set any circulation period for each title up to 21 days
- Titles may be renewed or may be returned early
- OneClickDigital interfaces with both Windows and MAC software and each has the capability to download and transfer to a mobile device
- The website offers audiovisual tutorials
- Easy account set up and downloads
