Gale Virtual Reference Library:

Baker's Biographical Dictionary of Popular Musicians Since 1990

f music is your passion: Who sang "I Will Always Love You" first in the 70's, before Whitney Houston made it a hit song in *The Bodyguard*? Can you name three hit songs of Celine Dion since 1990? What are the names of three former members of Destiny's Child? What is the real name of rapper 50 Cent? What does the word "emceeing" in hiphop music mean?

You can find the answers to these questions and more in one of the many online e-reference books of the Hawai'i State Public Library System. Log on to the HSPLS homepage: www.librarieshawaii.org and access Baker's Biographical Dictionary; click on Other Databases in the navigation column on the left; scroll down and select Gale Virtual Reference Library. To search from your home computer, enter your valid library card number and click on Proceed. If searching in the library, just click on Gale Virtual Reference Library; then scroll down to Arts and select View Publications; scroll down and click Baker's Biographical Dictionary of Popular Musicians Since 1990: at the next screen, check the box next to Within This Publication; and type your desired keywords or personal names in the search window.

Written by experts on popular music (professors, music critics, writers, journalists, etc.) Baker's Biographical Dictionary includes more than 550 entries focusing on artists active from 1990-2003. Besides individual artists, groups in all popular styles are listed: rock/pop, R&B, rap/hip-hop, country, electronica, folk, jazz, Latin, crossover classical, musical theater, new age, and world. Each entry covers biographical and career

information, including real name, birth date, birth place, artist's genre, best-selling album since 1990, hit songs since 1990, plus a critical discussion on the artist's importance. Four articles in an appendix cover major trends in pop music since 1990.

Academy Award winner George Clooney stars in this politically-charged thriller that unfolds against the intrigues and corruption of the global oil industry.


WORD WARS
