Hawaii's Tight Economy **Impacts Libraries**

State Board of Education committee has approved the proposed 2008-09 spending plan for the Hawaii State Public Library System – a plan which included a \$2.1 million budget cut due to a slowdown in Hawaii's economy. The BOE's Public Libraries and Student Support Services Committee voted last month to approve the proposed \$28.7 million spending plan for Hawaii's 51 public libraries. To meet this \$2.1 million reduction, library officials plan to elimi-

nate more than \$600,000 for energy-saving projects, reduce our \$2.4 million general fund book budget by \$400,000, lengthen the hiring process to gain \$180,000 in staff vacancy turnover savings, in addition to other measures. The proposed 2008-09 budget is about 7 percent less than the previous fiscal year, but HSPLS was able to meet these cuts without reducing days or hours of service, or eliminating staff positions.

In light of the present cutbacks and the high probability of future budget restrictions, HSPLS encourages you to contact your legislators and express how important library collections, programs and services are to you, your family and your community. Public libraries provide a wealth of materials, programs and services at incalculable savings to all library users (see related article). HSPLS appreciates your continued support and patronage!



THE DIVING BELL AND THE BUTTER-FLY


The remarkable tale of Jean-Dominique Bauby, the world-renowned editor of *French Elle* magazine, who suffered

THE GREAT DEBATERS


Denzel Washington and Forest Whitaker star in this drama based on a true story which chronicles the journey of Professor Melvin Tolson, a debate team coach who

In conjunction with the "Key Ingredients" exhibit, Kapolei Public Library is scheduled to host a variety of free programs featuring storytellers, author visits,

sustainability workshops through organic gardening, and cooking demonstrations by Kapolei High School culinary students. These programs are sponsored by Hawaii Council for the Humanities, the Friends of the Library Kapolei, Grace Pacific Corp., and StorSecure Self-Storage. Programs are subject to change.

Call the library two weeks in advance if a sign language interpreter or other special accommodation is needed for any of these programs.

Following its visit to Kapolei Public Library, the "Key Ingredients" exhibit is scheduled to travel to the Lyman Museum in Hilo (Oct. 31-Jan. 31, 2009) and will end its Hawaii run at Maui Community College in Kahului (Feb. 14-Apr. 12, 2009).

HSPLS Launches Wi-Fi Service

More library "hot spots" planned


alt Lake-Moanalua Public Library recently became the first Hawaii State Public Library System (HSPLS) branch to offer wireless internet access for our patrons. This initial pilot project has been very well received by the public, and it has provided HSPLS with valuable insight and experience as we prepare to expand wireless access to five additional branches throughout the state.

Upon entering this library, patrons may turn on their notebook/laptop computer or wireless device and start surfing the net (802.11b or 802.11g wireless networking required). The internet may be accessed from anywhere in the library, so you will no longer be limited to the library's computer areas.

Salt Lake -Moanalua Public Library is the first of several HSPLS libraries that will be launching free public wireless internet access in the coming months. Planned future Wi-Fi libraries will in-

clude the following public libraries: Hawaii State Library, Kaneohe, McCully-Moiliili (Oahu); Kailua-Kona (Hawaii); Princeville (Kauai) and Wailuku (Maui).

Users are strongly advised to use caution and discretion when sending or receiving any confidential information over the Internet, as this will be an unsecured and unfiltered connection. Users must also agree to abide by the HSPLS House Rules, Internet Acceptable Use Policy and all other relevant policies.
